Treventus launches scanner for books

Treventus, which develops hardware and software solutions for mass digitisation projects, has launched the ScanRobot 2.0 MDS for the high speed mass digitisation of huge book inventories.

The very gentle book scanner scans two pages at once and turns the pages automatically after scanning.

It can scan books in colour, grevscale and black and white



including covers and images.

The books are only opened to a 60 degree angle to prevent over stretching and damage to the spine.

Books with widely varying paper densities, porosities and textures can all be easily scanned.

Product of the day

Using a unique prism technology and automatic book cradle alignment each page is scanned distortion-free right up to the book binding.

Due to the unique and simple concept, it is suited for libraries and archives as well as for large digitisation projects.

It can scan up to 2,500 pages per hour in automatic mode and up to 1,000 pages per hour in semi-automatic mode. It weighs around 260 kilos.
